# **Fingertip Pulse Oximeter**

### **USER MANUAL**

### **General Description**

Oxygen Saturation is a percentage of Oxyhemoglobin (HbO<sub>2</sub>) capacity, compounded with oxygen, by all combinative hemoglobin (Hb) capacity in blood. The fingertip pulse oximeter features low power consumption, convenient operation and portability. Place one fingertip into the photoelectric sensor for diagnosis and the pulse rate and oxygen saturation will appear on the display. It has been proven in clinical experiments that it also features high precision and repeatability.

### **Precautions For Use**

- Before use, carefully read the manual.

  Operation of the fingertip pulse oximeter may be affected by the use of an electrosurgical unit (ESU).

  The fingertip pulse oximeter must be able to measure the pulse properly to obtain an accurate SpO<sub>2</sub> measurement. Verify that nothing is hindering the pulse measurement before relying on the SpO<sub>2</sub> measurement.
- On not use the fingertip pulse oximeter in a fixed for environment.

  Do not use the fingertip pulse oximeter in situations where alarms are required. The device has no alarms, It is not for continuous monitoring.
- Do not use the fingertip pulse oximeter in an explosive atmosphere.
- The fingertip pulse oximeter is intended only as an adjunct in User assessment. It must be used in conjunction with other
- methods of assessing clinical signs and symptoms. In order to ensure correct sensor alignment and skin integrity, the maximum application time at a single site for our device should be less than half an hour. Do not sterilize the device using autoclaving, ethylene oxide sterilizing, or immersing the device in liquid. The device is not
- intended for sterilization.

## Inaccurate measurements may be caused by

- Significant levels of dysfunctional hemoglobin (such as carbonyl hemoglobin or methemoglobin).
- Intravascular dyes such as indocyanine green or methylene blue.
- High ambient light. Shield the sensor area if necessary. Excessive User movement.
- High-frequency electrosurgical interference and defibrillators
  Venous pulsations.
- Placement of a sensor on an extremity with a blood pressure cuff, arterial catheter, or intravascular line.
- The User has hypotension, severe vasoconstriction, severe anemia, or hypothermia.
- Fingernail polish or false fingernails.
  Weak pulse quality (low perfusion).
  Low hemoglobin.


### Operation Instructions

- Install two AAA batteries according to the Battery Installation instructions.
- Place one of your fingers into the rubber opening of the pulse oximeter.
- Press the switch button one time on front panel to turn the pulse eximeter on.
- Reep your hands still for the reading. Do not shake your finger during the test, It is recommended that you do not move your body while taking a reading.

  Read the data from the display screen
- Press the power switch for longer than one second, will adjust the brightness of the oximeter. There are 10 levels of brightness. The default is level four.

After turning on the Oximeter, each time you press the power switch, the Oximeter will switch to anothe















Front Panel

The pulse bar less than 30% indicates signal inadequacy and the displayed SpO<sub>2</sub> and pulse rate value is potentially incorrect.

### Battery Installation

- Install two AAA batteries into the battery compartment. Match the plus (+) and minus (-) signs in the compartment. If the polarities are not matched, damage may be caused to the oximeter
- Slide the battery door cover horizontally along the arrow shown as the picture.

Please remove the batteries if the pulse oximeter will not be used for long periods of time.











### Using the Lanyard

- Thread thinner end of the lanyard through the hanging hole.
- Thread thicker end of the lanyard through the threaded end before pulling it tightly.

- Keep the oximeter away from young children, Small items such as the battery door, battery, and lanyard are choking hazards.
- Do not hang the lanyard from the device's electrical wire.

  Please notice that the lanyard which is tied to the oximeter may cause strangulation due to excessive length.

- Maintenance and Storage Replace the batteries in a timely manner when low voltage lamp is lighted. Clean surface of the fingertip oximeter before it is used in diagnosis for Users. Remove the batteries if the oximeter is not operated for a long time. It is best to store the product in  $-20 \, \text{C} - 155 \, \text{C}$  and  $\leq 93\%$  humidity.

- Keep in a dry place. Extreme moisture may affect oximeter lifetime and may cause damage.
- Dispose of battery properly; follow any applicable local battery disposal la

Cleaning the fingertip pulse oximeter
Please use medical alcohol to clean the silicone touching the finger inside of oximeter with a soft cloth dampened with 70%

isopropyl alcohol. Also clean the being tested finger using alcohol before and after each test.

The fingertip pulse eximeter requires no routine calibration or maintenance other than replacement of batteries.

The use life of the device is five years when it is used for 15 measurements every day and 10 minutes per one measurement. Stop using and contact local service center if one of the following cases occurs:



A functional tester cannot be used to assess the accuracy of a pulse oximeter monitor or sensor. Clinical testing is used to establish the SpO<sub>2</sub> accuracy. The measured arterial hemoglobin saturation value (SpO<sub>2</sub>) of the sensors is compared to arterial hemoglobin oxygen (SaO<sub>2</sub>) value, determined from blood samples with a laboratory Co-oximeter. The accuracy of the sensors in comparison to the CO-oximeter samples measured over the SpO<sub>2</sub> range of 70%-100%, Accuracy data is calculated using the root-mean-squared (Arms value) for all subjects, per ISO 9919:2005, Medical Electrical Equipment – Particular requirements for the basic safety and essential performance of pulse oximeter equipment for use.

A functional tester is used to measure how accurately Fingertip Pulse Oximeter is reproducing the specified calibration curve and

the PR accuracy.
The model of functional tester is Index2 FLUKE simulator and the version is 2.1.3.


